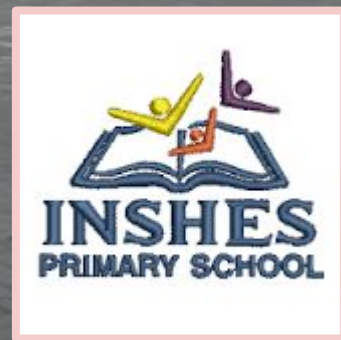

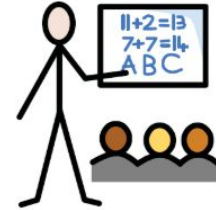

Learning helps you grow with confidence and dignity. Every child deserves the chance to learn, be proud, and succeed.

What is Human Dignity?

Every human being is important and special. We call this human dignity.

Respect for human dignity means that we should be friendly and kind to others and it is wrong to hurt other people or make them feel bad about themselves.

No matter how others treat you, they never have the right to take away your human dignity.

When you learn what human dignity means to you, you are less likely to accept when other people hurt, discriminate or put someone down.

Being treated unfairly because you look or learn differently

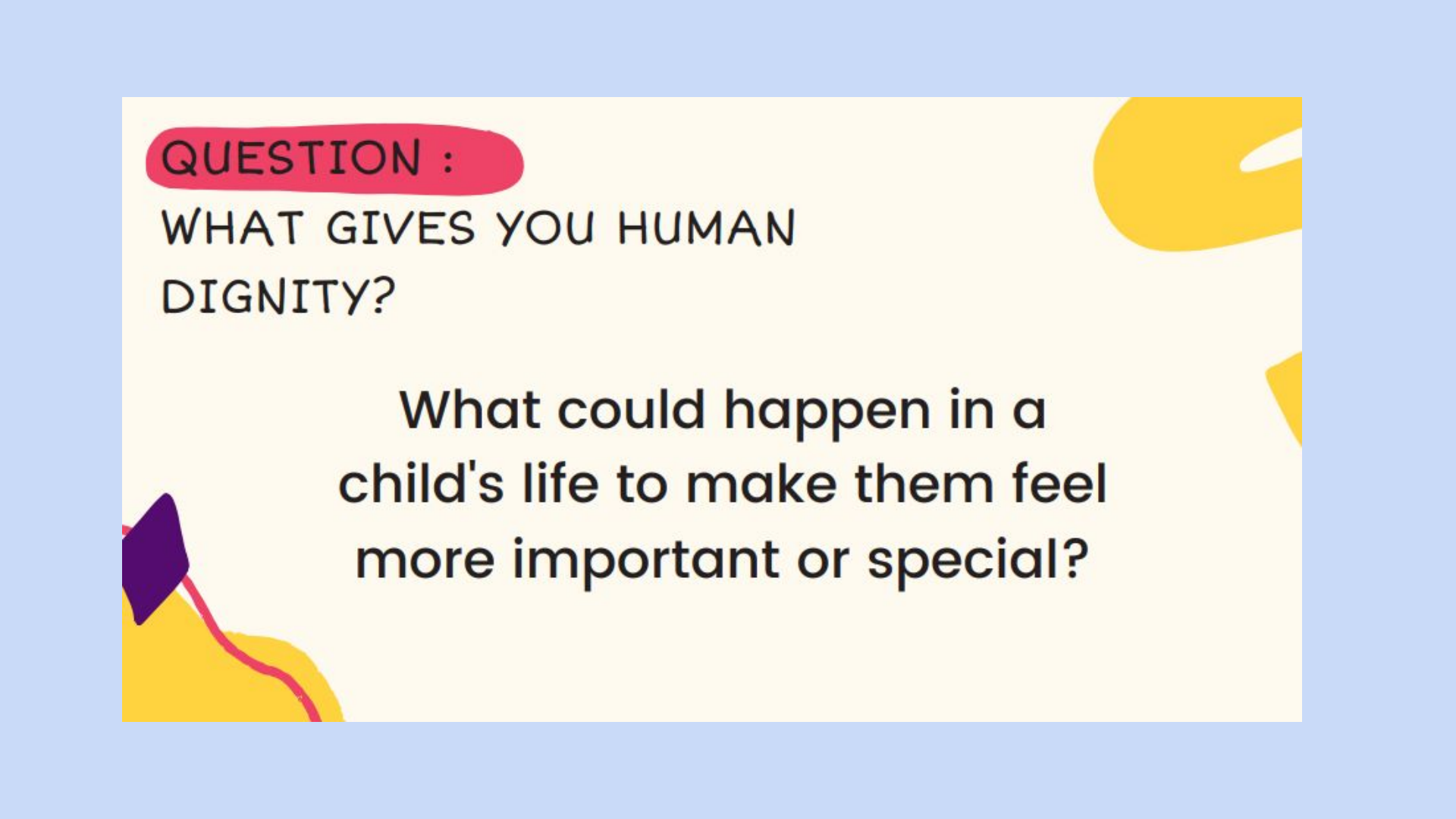
“Everyone has the right to be treated with kindness, we should value difference and what makes us who we are!

War and conflict around the world

“When children have to leave their homes or can’t go to school because of war, their safety, voice, and rights are affected – and that can hurt their dignity.”

Not being listened to when you try to speak

“When no one listens, it feels like your thoughts don’t matter.”

Being listened to

“When someone really listens to what you’re saying, it shows your voice matters.”

Someone checking you're okay when you're upset

“When someone notices and cares, it shows you’re important.”

Every time we treat someone with kindness and fairness, **we help their dignity grow** — just like watering a plant.

Having a choice in your learning

“When you help decide what or how you learn, it shows your ideas are respected.”

Being treated kindly, even when you make a mistake

“It shows that people still value you, even when things go wrong.”

matter. That's not dignity

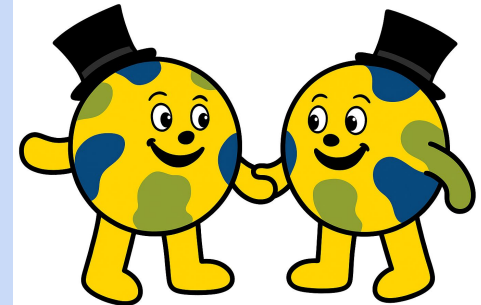

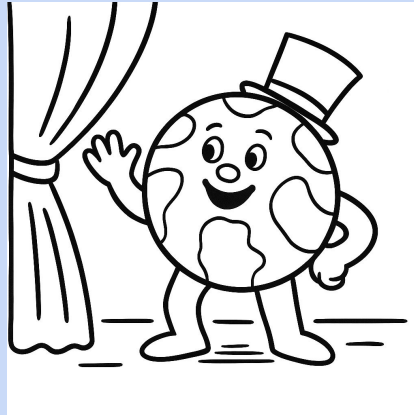

- Help keep our environment clean



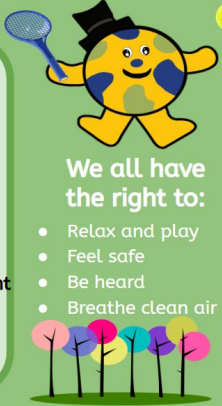

- Play outdoors during break and lunchtime



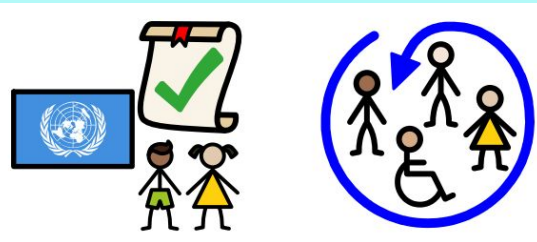
